6. Alone No More

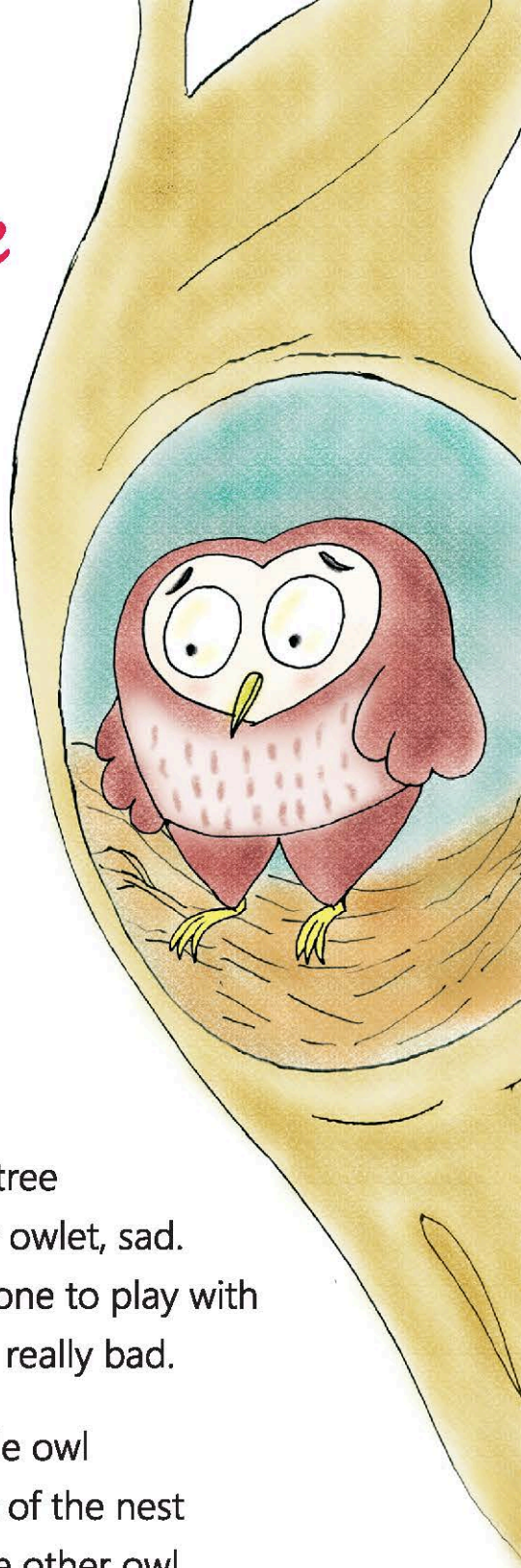
Little owl felt sad

And chat and flap and play.

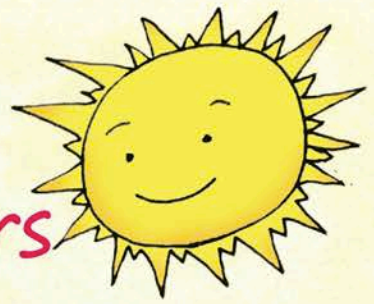


In the next tree

Dressed in his best.



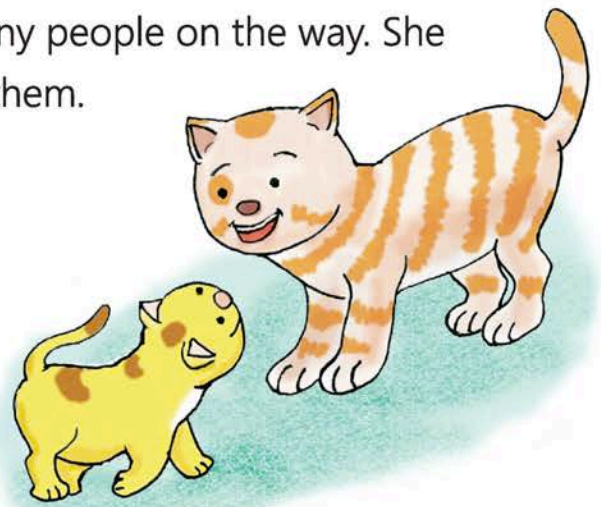
8. Kitu and the Strangers

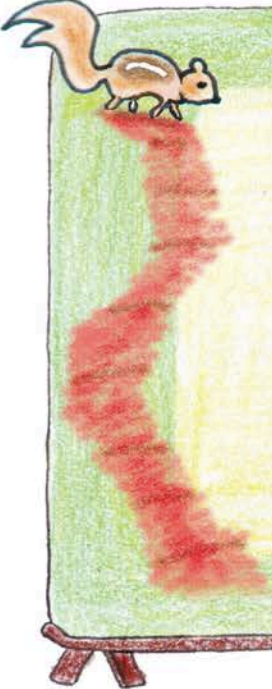
